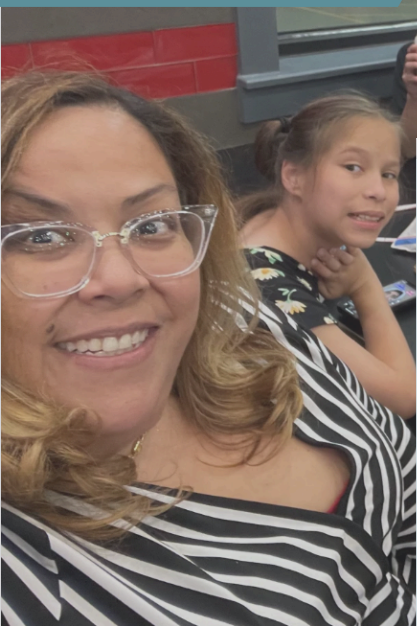




Too Much but Not Enough

"Mateo" lives with intellectual disability and autism. Unable to fully meet his needs at home, the state placed him in a group home at age 18 where he was arrested within months. He was deemed either too high acuity or too aggressive and kicked out or arrested. He has cycled through so many group homes that there is nowhere left to go. He is too high acuity for group homes, but too stable for the hospital leaving him with no state-supported option.

Reimagining what long-term care looks like:



We need solutions other than group homes or hospitals.

People needing long-term care deserve to live with dignity, purpose, and support that neither of these can appropriately provide.

Community-based care looks like:

- Housing modeled after retirement communities, not acute hospital settings
- Intentional campus-style settings that foster community
- Opportunities to engage in work and meaningful social engagement, as appropriate
- 24/7 supervision and support for those with higher support needs
